social, religious and economic standards of the nation greatly improved if the white man would adopt and follow some of the creeds of the American Indian, ac-cording to Ernest Thompson Seton, president of the Seton Institute at Santa Fe, N. M.

Red Man's

The institute, which is devoted to preservation of the lore and culture of American Indians, has been under direction of the 78year-old author, painter and lecturer since it was founded.

Seton believes the Indian never has been rightfully presented to the public. He says that the red man is not a bloodthirsty savage, as motion pictures and books

"In arts and culture, the red man has far exceeded the white man," Seton said. "He has a religious tolerance and it would be well for the rest of the world to adopt it. He had a rhythm in his songs and dances the white man has never been able to equal.

White Vices Adopted

"Until the white man invaded these shores, the redskin did not know dishonesty. His morals were higher then than they are today after the white man's vices and creeds were introduced.


"They had a creed that they followed. The culture of the Indian was based on spiritual things. Their songs and dances are part of their religion and they sing songs their spirit whispers. The white man's culture is fundamentally material. The Indian respects religions of the others and measures success in what he has done for his fellow men, services rendered. Unless we change our methods of neasuring success we are headed for destruction.

"The Indian maid has it all over the American woman in dress, when she sticks to the Indian costume. She may appear a freak in the white woman's clothes, but ir her native costume she is perfect.

Called Best Dancer "As a race, the Indian is the best dancer in the world. In basket weaving or similar arts and crafts they are perfect, surpassing the work of the white man.

"The average person, if he were to see a true Indian dance, would not accept it as the real thing. The true dances are never presented on the stage because the public expects only a war dance." Seton has written more than 40
