Record State Milk Crop's Uses Traced

What did Wisconsin dairy plants do with the largest quantity of milk ever produced in the state in any one year? This question is being answered in the 1938 reports of more than 3,000 plants, says the crop reporting service of the Wisconsin and United States departments of agriculture.

About 11.6 billion pounds were produced in the state during 1938. The greater part of the milk is used in manufacture of butter, cheese, and condensery products. With the increased milk production last year and low prices some changes are expected in the amount of various products to be made.

Stoughton Wins 41-26 Over Madison Five

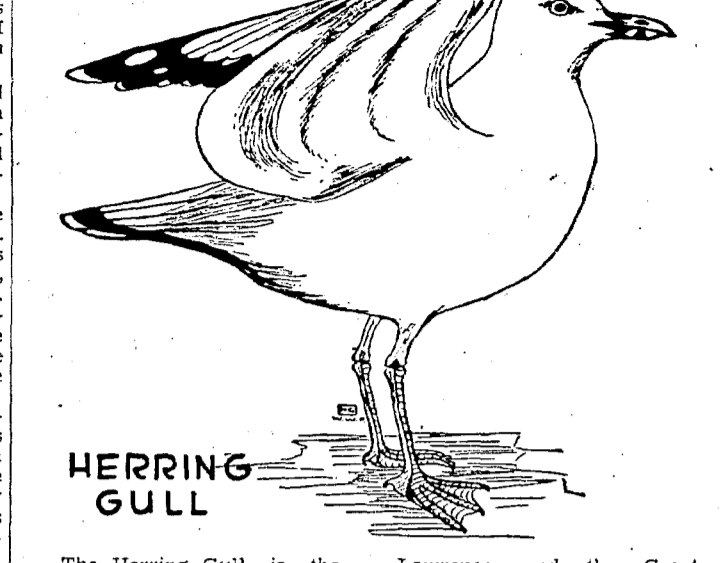
