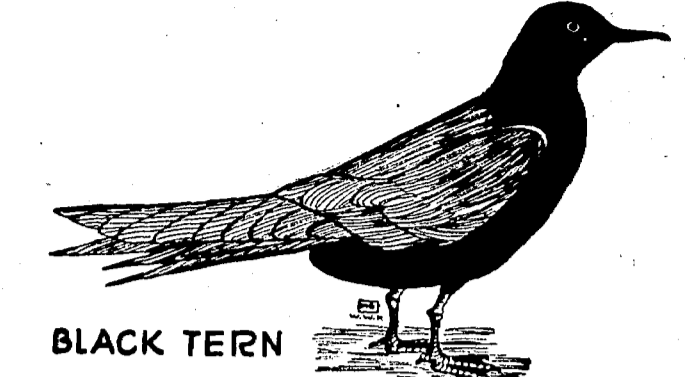

Who's Who Among Wisconsin Birds



Next to the rare Least Tern the Black Tern is the smallest and it is the most common of Wisconsin terns. It is a medium sized bird, largely coal black except for a dark gray mantle and it has a short, notched tail. In late summer and fall it becomes mottled and has a much lighter appearance.

This is the bird commonly seen flying a leisurely but erratic course over water, catching insects or darting to the water to seize a small fish that happened to be near the surface.

It is an abundant summer resident in Wisconsin, breeding throughout the state. Its nesting range is the interior of North America from western New York to California and from Tennessee, northern Missouri and Colorado north to eastern Alaska, central Manitoba and Ontario. It winters from the Gulf of

wherever to buy a television set will be able to get scheduled programs about the time the World's Fair opens this summer, Murray said. Receivers will produce 441-line images.

This will mark the start of a new, many-sided, far-reaching, intriguing industry, belonging half to the entertainment world and half to communications. But whether the American public will accept it quickly remains to be seen," he added.

In Great Britain, Murray said, acceptance of television has been disappointing. Only about 5,000 sets have been sold. Broadcasts there have been mostly of outdoor events.

Germany has been trying out television for some time and already is aware of its military possibilities, he pointed out.

Several types of television receivers will be offered to the public. Some will have all the wave bands found on radios, others will be equipped with phonographs and maybe some manufacturer will offer a television-bar.

One of the chief obstacles to regular television programs will be the establishment of a network for chain broadcasting and, of course, capital in large sums for talent, studios, and equipment.

Eight companies in the United States now are working on television. Murray said efforts of each doubtless will be known before 1940.

The would-be television set buyer, he said, should not expect too much in quality at first, buy a cheaper set or—above all else—throw away his radio.

"There will always be room for radio."
