Old Ranger Has Yarn Of 1849 Gold Rush Set For Friday Night; Favorite Melodies To Be Featured By Lyman

The story of a newspaper printer whose own actions usually made front page news, will be told by the Old Renger during the Death Valley D.As program Friday, at 9:30 p. m., over WEAF. Alex Hum, nephew of former Governor Hum of New York, worked as a printer on The Nevada Democrat in the days immediately following the gold rush in 1849. He slept in a coffin, used a town muistrel show as a private serenade, and, repulsed by the Circus girl he loved, tried to commit suicide by shooting his own daguerreotype. 
