Truckers Told to File New Rate Schedules

The state public service commission today ordered contract motor carriers who transport household goods and office furniture and equipment within Wis-consin to file new rate schedules, and regulations effective March 1.

Since 1935, when rates were last established, there have been changes in the conditions sur-rounding the trucking industry, especially in Milwaukee, the com-mission said.

As a result minimum basic rates have been reduced to \$2.75 per hour for vehicle and driver in Milwaukee county plus \$1 per hour for each additional man; \$2.25 per hour plus 75 cents per per hour for each additional mar n cities of 15,000 to 100,000 population; and \$1.25 per hour plus 65 cents per hour for each added helper in smaller communities.



EASTERN WHIP-POOR-WILL

The Wisconsin Whip-Poor-Will is called the "Eastern" by bird students to distinguish it from southern varieties that do not come to this section of

Seldom seen, the Whip-Poor-Will would remain un-known to most people were it not for its publicity method of constantly repeating its name.
Once common in Wisconsin,
this bird has become uncommon in more thickly settled parts of the state, probably because of destruction of woods and undergrowth in which it lives.

The Whip-Poor-Will rests during the day, either on the ground or on some low perch. With the coming of dusk it becomes active and often issues its call throughout the night. It is the color of dead leaves and dead wood with a long, rounded tail. It has an unusually large mouth.

It feeds largely upon nightflying in sects, especially moths, mosquitoes and June

Before spring has well started, the Whip-Poor-Will arrives in Wisconsin from its winter home. Its winters are spent from the lowlands of South Carolina and the Gulf states south to Honduras, Salvador and occasionally to Costa Rica.

The Whip-Poor-Will makes no nest. It lays its eggs on the bare Wisconsin ground or on dead leaves, usually in with or among bushes in clearings. The bird blends so well with the dull background that it is difficult to distinguish it while it

is on the nest.

Many bird students in the cities never hear the Whip-Poor-Will. In some sections of the state it can be depended upon for nightly concerts. dominating sound through the long dark hours to dawn. 0 0 0




