Who's Who Among Wisconsin Birds



PILEATED WOODPECKER

The Northern Pileated Woodpecker is a common permanent resident of Wisconsin. The bird is now confined to the heavy timber tracts of the northern part of the state and along the Wisconsin river bottoms. It is nearly as big as a crow, has a clear black back and a scarlet crest. It shows a white patch on the wing in flight and is the giant of Wisconsin woodpeckers.

It inhabits an area that starts with the forests of Canada from Mackenzie and Manitoba east to New Brunswick and Nova Scotia and south to Illinois and Pennsylvania and farther south in the Alleghenies.

Its food is principally ants, mostly carpenter ants which eat the wood of trees, wood-boring beetles, flies, caterpillars, seeds and some inner tree bark. It is considered most valuable as a tree protector against damaging insects. It cuts through solid wood to get to ants and like the rest of the woodpecker family has a specially adapted tongue to help it collect its most desirable food.

The Northern Pileated Woodpecker nests in a hole in a dead stub or a live tree, from 18 to 75 feet from the ground. (Scrapbook page 48 of the second series of the educational program of the Wisconsin Wildlife Federation in cooperation with the Department of Public Instruction.)

Pi Lambda Theta to Discuss Propaganda Whoops and Measles Up in December

Pi Lambda Theta, a national honorary educational fraternity for women, will hold a discussion meeting Wednesday at 7:30 p. m. in the Memorial Union on the subject "Propaganda, What Is It?" Miss Ethel Kaup, program chairman of the fraternity, announced today. The discussion will be conducted by Mrs. Janet Miller, chairman, and Dorothy Ryan, Evelyn Hahn, Grace Seborg, and Betty Teckemeyer. A second meeting will be held March 1 with Gertrude L. Hanson, chairman, and Leila Stevens, Lucile Clock, Rita Springhorn, Jane Calvi, and Cora M. Nelson leading the discussion on "Instruments for Propaganda."

The last of the series will be held April 26 on "Propaganda: What the Schools Can Do." Leading the discussion will be Dorothy Greenleaf, chairman, and Jean Hauskey, Lorraine Hubbard, Eleanor Nerdrum, Marion Powers, Josephine Simonson, and Dora Rude. Immunization programs among children throughout the state were reflected in favorable December showings with only eight cases of diphtheria, 20 less than average, and but 28 cases of scarlet fever, a decrease of 30 cases, the board reported.

Other December case totals: scarlet fever, 742, down 318; chickenpox, 2,521, down 73; tuberculosis, 93, down 31; typhoid fever, four, down two; gonorrhea, 90, down 40 and syphilis 39 newly reported cases, up five over the six-year December average.
