Hit Comedy Flashing On Lyric Screen

Frank Capra and Robert Riskin deliver their most thoroly entertaining screen comedy, "You Can't Take It With You," to the Lyric theatre Tuesday. Difficult as the feat seems to be, these unerring collbaorators have exceeded even their former film masterpieces-"It Happened One Night," "Mr. Deeds Goes to Town," "Lost Horizon" and the others. It is easily the greatest picture in the career of Hollywood's top director-writer team.

"You Can't Take It With You" is a picturization of the Pulitzer prize-winning stage play by George S. Kaufman and Moss Hart The stage play's delightful drolleries and farcical fun have been retained to a large degree while a generous measure of comedydrama and a few dashes of sentiment have been added to give verisimilitude to the motivation. The result is a superbly ingratiating picture, interwoven with romance and genuine emotion.

An all-star cast, in the purest sense of the phrase, turns in a gallery of impeccable performances. Jean Arthur, Lionel Barrymore, James Stewart, Edward Arnold, Mischa Auer and Spring Byington are especially worthy of mention. Equally sharing top honors, however, are Ann Miller, Donald Meck, Dub Taylor, Halliwell Hobbes, II. B. Warner, Mary Forbes and Samuel S. Hinds.


