DREDGE MINING NOW DESIGNED TO SAVE SOIL

MEDFORD, Ore., Feb. 9.—(UP)—A new method of dredge mining, adopted in an effort to save valuable land ruined under the old system, is being given a trial on Poor Man's creek 10 miles west of here.

In ordinary dredge or hydraulic mining, the operations, leave a scarred surface of rock on which nothing can grow. The Glide Foundation company of San Francisco, operating a gold dredge on Poor Man's creek, is following a different system.

Top soil, to the depth of 8 to 10 feet, is first removed with "bulldozers." After this operation the gravel bearing the gold is washed thru the dredge, and used as a foundation for the future fields. The top soil is placed back on top of the rock.

Melton Cotton, overseer for the Glide company, estimated that hundreds of acres can be grazed on land reclaimed from what would ordinarily be ruin. The company plans dredging operations over 5,000 acres.
