NOONE (United Press Staff Writer) NEW YORK (U.P.)—The odds are against a winter book favorite starting in the Kentucky Derby, but it would be a poor way to risk money this year because El Chico, 4-1 chance for the blue grass classic, was far advanced today in training for his campaign as a three year old.

An inspection of the John P. Grier-La Chica colt who won seven straight from William J. Ziegler as a two year old, revealed a fully matured horse.

Under the capable guidance of John McGee, El Chico has thrived at Belmont Park while Matt Brady chief conditioner for Ziegler, spent the winter in California supervising the campaign of lesser lights of the stable.

El Chico could go to the races much sooner than May 6, the Derby date, McGee said, and probably emerge triumphant. "He is the most docile thoroughbred I ever had the pleasure of handling. Hasn't caused me a minute's worry, and at no time have I been anxious about his health."
