

Red Sox Catcher Berg Will Be Heard On Quiz Program

Scholarly Moe To Be Right At Home With Talented Trio As He Is Lawyer And Linguist Of Note

Big-league baseball will supply the guest for the Information Please program Tuesday at 8:30 p. m. over WJZ in the person of the scholarly Moe Berg, catcher for the Boston Red Sox.

Morris Berg, a native of New York, was graduated from Princeton in 1923. He has played with the Brooklyn Dodgers, Chicago White Sox, Cleveland and Washington, besides the Boston team.

Others to be interviewed by Gabriel Heatter will include J. Frank Norris, citizen turned sleuth who brought the convicted murderer, Robert Blake, writer of the sensational play, "The Last Mile," to justice; Skippy Currie, the country's youngest radio announcer; Peter Baum, the octogenarian who has just returned to America after a seven year flight in Europe; and a railroad dining-car steward who has streamlined his "First call to dinner."

Writer of the lead article in the current Saturday Evening Post, "Hitler Wasn't Bluffing," Johnston, editor of Aviation Magazine, will tell "We, The People" listeners of the German chancellor's rapidly developing facilities for the manufacture of army planes. The American editor was invited to study Germany's recent progress in aviation at the invitation of Doctor Adolf Baemker, president of the Lilienthal Society, her great institute of aeronautical sciences.

Bernard Macfadden, publisher, who returned recently to this country from a two-month stay in England and on the continent, will discuss the possibility of a European war when he appears as guest speaker during the Mary and Bob program Tuesday at 9 p. m. over WJZ. The subject of the publisher's talk will be "War Coming To Europe."
