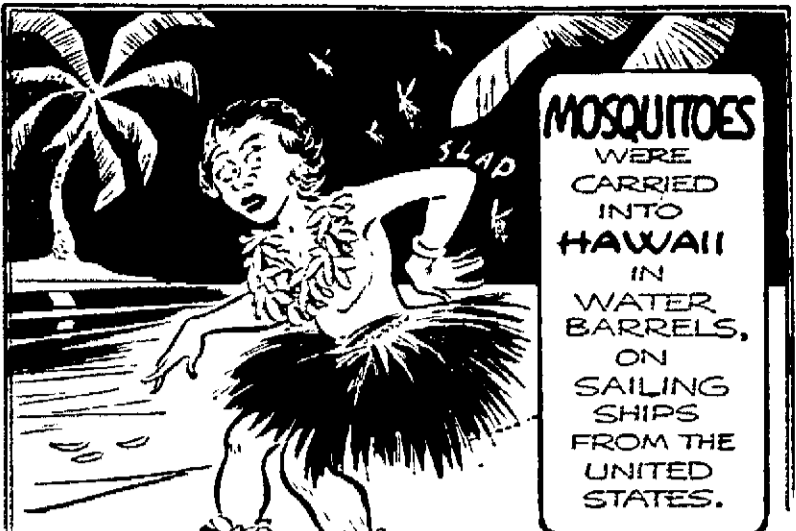

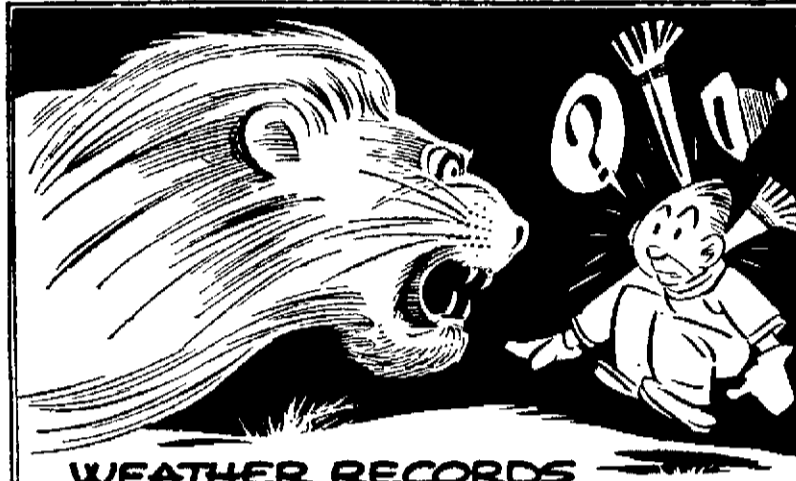

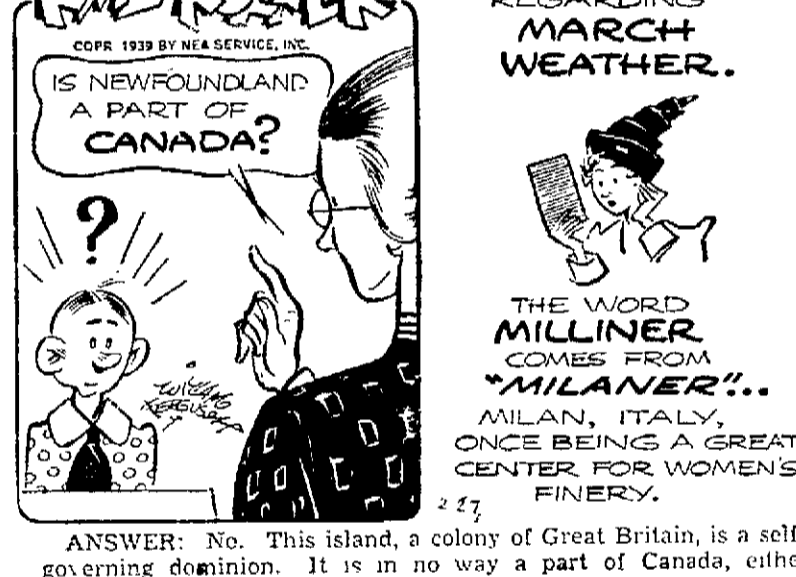

Of all the famous novelists who ever lived, Dumas was probably the most prolific and one of the most successful. In his lifetime he wrote something like 1200 volumes, and practically every one had a successful sale.
