# ADMIRAL FRANCO **Dorothy Parker Secured As** Expert For "Quiz" Program

### Famous Wit Will Be Heard At 8:30 P. M. Tuesday; "Inside Story" Of Foundling Home To Be Related

Dorothy Parker, wit, poet and short-story writer, will serve on the Information Please board of experts Tuesday, sitting alongside Franklin P. Adams, one of the regulars of the board, who first encouraged her by printing her verses: in his column in the old New York Mail. The program will be broadcast over WJZ from \$:30 to 9:00 p. m.

The other guest experts on that program will be Elmer Davis, newspaperman and author, and the other regular John Kieran, with Clifton Fadiman trying to stump them with tricky questions.

Miss Parker's first volume of sparkling verse was "Enough Rope." published in 1927. Her second collection was "Sunset Gun." Her third book, "Laments for the living," contained a story, "Big Blonde," that won the O. Henry Memorial

prize. Davis, an Indianan and Rhodes scholar, has written a number of books.
