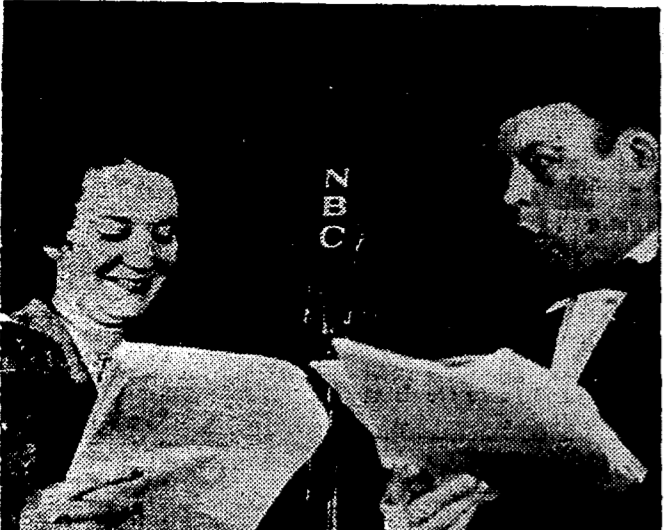

Vitamin B Helps After Illness, Doctor Declares

When ill, vitamin B is essential in your diet, Dr. Mabel G. Masten, associate prof. of Neuropsychiatry at the University of Wisconsin, told the third district Wisconsin Nurses assn. Tuesday night in the Hotel Loraine. "Surgical patients and those who had high fevers need additional vitamin B found in concentrated liquid and dry forms," the speaker said. "Sources of this vitamin are vegetables, pork, liver, heart, natural cereals, and whole wheat bread. "Deficiency in vitamin B may result in pellagra, beri beri, mental disturbances, and death," Dr. Masten asserted. "Symptoms are atrophy and scaling of the skin, pain and distorted sensations in the nervous system, loss of weight and appetite."
