

STOCK PRICES RESUME SLUMP

Leading Issues Head Downward As European Crisis Brings Selling

NEW YORK, March 18—(AP)—Leading stocks fluttered downward in today's early market dealings. Fresh worries over European war dangers were given as the main cause of selling.

At a lively start, with blocks of several thousand shares changing hands, losers of fractions to 3 points included U. S. Steel, Chrysler, Loew's, Bethlehem Steel, Westinghouse, Pennsylvania, N. Y. Central, Consolidated Edison, Sears Roebuck, Douglas Aircraft and Montgomery Ward.

Some attention was given the survey of the federal reserve board disclosing department store sales for the week ended March 11 were up 2 per cent over the corresponding week. The year-to-year increase in the preceding week was 7 per cent.

Those holding building company shares noted forecasts that fully 500,000 new dwelling units in all types of communities might be constructed this year, a gain of about 45 per cent over last year.

ROOSEVELT SON UNPERTURBED

WASHINGTON, March 18—(AP)—James Roosevelt, son of the President, apparently was unperturbed today at being named defendant in a Justice Department anti-trust suit against the motion picture industry.

At Hollywood, where he is a board member of United Artists, his only comment was:

"I believe I have been named in the place of James Mulvey whose place I took on the United Artists board."

The name of the President's son and former secretary was mentioned by the Justice department yesterday as substitute for Mulvey along with several other new motion picture company officials whose employers were named in a monopoly suit filed several months ago in the federal southern district of New York. The suit charged several major producers with controlling the distribution and exhibition of class A pictures in violation of federal anti-trust laws.

2,000 WITNESS PASSION PLAY

More than 2,000 men, women and children witnessed the first day's presentation of the Passion Play production Friday in McMorial Hall.

Four more Lima performances are on the schedule for Saturday and Sunday afternoon and evening before the big cast of players moves on to Kansas City. Capacity attendance for the final two days is indicated by the advance sale.

Josef Meier, heralded as the world's greatest Christus, held the spotlight in the two opening performances in the role of the Messiah. His wife, Clara Hume Meier, has the role of the Virgin Mary.

The production is being presented by the Leinen Players, the only professional company touring America with the Passion Play. The road performance is an outstanding Biblical story.

FINDLAY MAN TAKES LIFE IN TOLEDO HOTEL

FINDLAY, March 18—Funeral arrangements were being made today for Zeke Prowant, 35, of the South River Rd., Findlay, whose body was found hanging by an electric light cord in a Toledo hotel Friday afternoon. The family made identification of the body.

Coroner William M. Shapiro of Lucas Co. gave a verdict of suicide and said that the Findlay man had been dead for many hours.

Discovery of the body by police ended a two-day search for the father of three children. His wife said he left home Wednesday afternoon but did not say where he was going. She supposed he had driven directly to Toledo.

Hotel officials in Toledo said Prowant entered the hotel Wednesday evening and registered, using his right name. He checked out Thursday, however, and police said he probably went back to the room and committed suicide.

He was a driver for the Cleveland, Columbus and Cincinnati Trucking Co., and often spent several days away from home, but not when he was off duty, his family said.

Besides his wife and three children, Prowant is survived by his father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Nelson Prowant, who reside at his home on the River Rd.; two brothers and a sister, Ivan, of Mortimer, Clarence of Bowling Green, and Mrs. Cleo Johnson, of Battle Creek, Mich.
