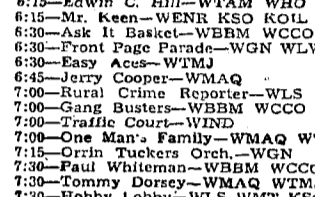

Abroad S. S. Matsonia - THOUGHTS WHILE SHAVING: If the Capital were situated farther west, it would take these European crises more calmly. Our west coast is infinitely more placid about the alarms of Mussolini and Hitler. Even the Japanese seem no more menacing around the Golden Gate than along the Potomac. And that's strange, as Westerners are more war-like. I'm forced to conclude that Washington is the heart of the Jitter Belt.

As if seven meals a day on shipboard were not enough, I have just become aware that there is always a bowl of fruit and a dish of bon bons kept replenished in each stateroom. Only a traitor to his class would observe in the ship's daily newspaper this morning that the relief rolls are up above three million again.

This afternoon the captain took us up on the bridge. Amid the bewildering array of controls there were three that impressed the ladies most—the three for detecting fire. One consists of a cabinet of nozzles connected with every part of the hold, so sensitive that even the smoke from a cigar would come wafting up. Another kicks up a fuss when the temperature anywhere aboard reaches 165 degrees. The third flashes red when an alarm bell is tapped.

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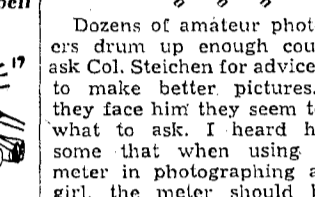
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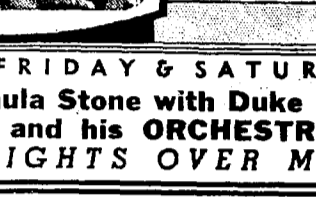
