NEW YORK—The Redbirds of yesteryear have flown away. Only Joe Medwick, Pepper Martin and Paul Dean remain of the Gas House Gang that won the pennant five years ago.

There is a new manager, too, Ray Blades, from Rochester and Columbus, Cardinal farm teams. There are new pitchers, two or three of them with unusual ability. There are new catchers, and infielders have sprung up all over the place.

There are new problems in the training camp at St. Petersburg, particularly at second base and in the mound department, but it must be said the recruits are the likeliest the Cards have had for several years.

Stu Martin Through
Leading candidate for second is Jack Sturdy, an athlete competitor of the Frankie Frisch type, and a great hand with a bat in the pinches. Sturdy comes from Rochester along with Blades, and despite a knee injury which kept him out of the game part of the season, he hit .299, including ten homers, several of his long hits winning ball games.

Branch Rickey says Stu Martin is through at second, so far as the Cards are concerned, but that doesn't mean that Sturdy doesn't have to beat Martin out of the job. A comeback by Martin, after his slump of last year, might win the nod for him.

Jimmy Brown seems to have established himself as the regular shortstop, with Don Guttridge at third and Mize, of course, at first. There are four shortstops in camp, Lynn Myers, Frank (Creepy) Crespi, Martin (Slats) Marion and Joe Oregno. None seems to be much of a hitter, and Brown, who hit .301 in 108 games with the Cards last year, must be given the edge.

Dean Appears Ready
Pitching help is expected to come from Paul Dean, of whom you may have heard, from Tom Sunkel, mound king from the Southern association, and Mort Cooper, Texas league strikeout leader.

Dean seemed to be himself again when he returned to the Cards last fall after a summer in the Texas league. Sunkel is a sinner without strike-out power, the best percentage and the most strikeouts in the Southern where he won 21 games for Atlanta.

Cooper has a great fast ball. Winning 13 games for Houston, he pitched seven shutouts, and came within a whisker of a perfect game against Oklahoma City that was spoiled by a pop single back of second. He had 201 strikeouts in 202 innings.
