



Ohioans Must Prove They **Helped Collect Sales Tax** To Profit

REDEEMABLE AFTER MAY 1

Receipts In Use Now Are Valueless: Lots Of \$100 Each Required

COLUMBUS, O., March 27 -(UP)-Thrifty Ohioans who plan to cash in on the new law permitting the redemption of sales tax receipts by acting on the claim they helped collect the tax should acquaint themselves with the new regulations laid down by the state ax commission.

The new stamps will be releemable at 3 per cent of their face value after May 1, but: Stamps must be presented lots of not less than \$100 face value (\$3 redemption value).

Stamps must be sorted by denominations, with those of the same denomination "securely fastened together by clipping, tying or binding," and "any intermingling of one denomination with a group grounds for disallowing the claim." An application for redemption on an official form prescribed by



The film version of the famous Broadway hit has probably been less altered from the original than any other play ever brought to the silver sheet. In every essential of plot and situation, the film and play are identical. The necessary compression of a two-anda-half hour play to fit the oneand-a-half hour requirements of a film offering was achieved by cutting down the dialogue and incidental bits of "business," thus enhancing the pace and entertainment value of the picture. The original play took place

entirely in a single hotel room. The camera's flexibility allows other scenes elsewhere in the hotel building and a theatre. Harpo Marx's role, that of Faker Englund, was necessarily played in pantomime, following his invarjable custom. In all other respects, however, the picture faithfully copies the play that kept New York audiences rolling with laughter for more than a year, with Groucho in the role of the harassed producer and Chico as his resourceful—and sometimes erazy!—aid.

Lucille Ball and Ann Miller have the feminine leads in the Lyric film, with Frank Albertson also in the supporting cast of "Room Service."
