By WALTER L. JOHNS NEW YORK—George (Twinkle-toes) Selkirk, the pride of Hunts-ville, Ontario, is not a major league manager, a club owner or a rookie. But he faces a mighty baseball problem in the Yankees training camp at St. Petersburg, Fla.

To the point, all Selkirk has to do is to beat out two of the most promising rookies in the game today for his left field job. You've heard their names whispered elsewhere. If not, they are Charley Keller and Joe Gallagher. Selkirk has been the regular Yankee left fielder for five years.

Keller Is Rookie Star It's a certainty that Joe Di Maggio will be in center field. Tommy Henrich has had the right field job for two years. That leaves left field up to Selkirk and the rooks, Keller and Gallagher.

Keller, a left-handed slugger, hit for a roaring .365 last year with Newark of the International League. All he did was lead the league with 149 runs and 211 hits. He drove in 129 scores. A graduate of the University of Maryland Keller has been a batting behemoth for two seasons, his only years in the pro field. Observers predict Keller will out-Di Maggio the Di Maggio as a rookie star. Although by no means a polished fielder, Keller is being groomed as the 1939 Yankee bat specialist.


