

# Young Tenor "Find" To Make Air Debut With Al Pearce

### Everett West, Night Club Singer, Becomes Regular Member Of Gang; Special Holy Week Program Arranged

Everett West, young tenor who was "discovered" singing in a Chicago night club by Al Pearce two weeks ago, will become a regular member of the Pearce Gang, and simultaneously make his network debut on the Pearce program Monday on WEAJ from 8 to 8:30 p. m.

West was singing at the Chez Parve in Chicago when Pearce heard him sing recently. Impressed by his lyric tenor voice, Pearce signed him immediately. He will go direct from Chicago to St. Louis to join the Pearce zanies, and will also appear in their stage show at the Fox theatre there.

### Events of Holy Week, from Christ's entry into Jerusalem to the Resurrection, will be described in dramatic and narrative form when "The Living God" is enacted over WEAJ in a series of five daily broadcasts, beginning Tuesday from 6:00 to 6:15 p. m.

Presented by the National Council of Catholic Men in cooperation with the National Broadcasting Co., "The Living God" will be dramatized by a cast of noted Hollywood actors and actresses, headed by Walter Connolly, famous character actor, will be heard as the announcer. Mary Carr, star of many silent films, will be cast as the old woman.

The voice of Jesus Christ will be enacted by Pedro de Cordoba, who, with Connolly, is editing "The Living God."

### Dog and cat lovers of suburban Westchester-co, N. Y., will be put on the spot on other subjects when they line up on Dr. Harry Hagen's True or False program in the WJZ broadcast Monday at 10 p. m.

In August, 1937, he was again heard on the Magic Key program as master of ceremonies.

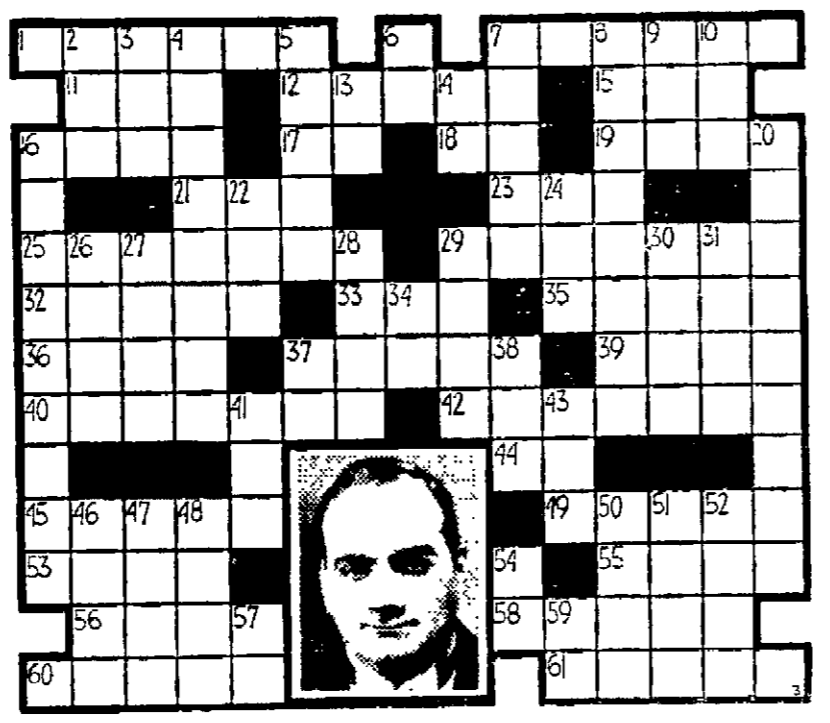

## REPORT GIVEN ON VOLUME OF STOCK AT WAPAKONETA

### WAPAKONETA, April 3—Monthly report of the Wapakoneta Producers shows a total of 545 cattle, 558 calves, 6117 hogs and 962 sheep or a total of 8180 head of livestock with a valuation of \$139,263.63.

### For the quarter ending March 31st, the Wapakoneta Producers show a total of 2159 cattle, 1711 calves, 14034 hogs and 4456 sheep in comparison with 1947 cattle, 1804 calves, 12,745 hogs and 4728 sheep handled during the first quarter in 1938. The difference represents a gain of 1136 head. The total valuation of the livestock handled during the period this year was \$413,604.71 and \$491,025.88 in 1938.

### The price paid for top hogs by the association on March 1st was \$8.00 per hundred, whereas at the close of the month the hog market had declined to a top of \$6.85, a reduction of \$1.15 per hundred weight. The price on the best cut and also on calves fell off around \$1 per hundred weight during the month. Sheep was the only species holding near steady and the lamb market advanced from \$8.85 paid on March 4th to \$9.15 at the end of the month.

## 63,000 CLEVELANDERS EAT INADEQUATELY, IS CLAIM

### CLEVELAND, April 3—(AP)—Frank G. Jones, city relief commissioner, today sought additional funds for the food costs in his budget.

### He said a survey showed more than 63,000 Clevelanders on relief, including 22,000 school children, have been eating 25 to 44 per cent less food than they should have according to federal standards of adequate diets. He declared the condition had existed for the last two years.

### The Cleveland food budget for a typical family of four man, woman, boy of 10 and girl of 8 is \$5.70 a week, Jones said. He maintained it should be \$7.37.

## SPAIN ROUNDS UP SOLDIERS

### Classification As To Liability For Reprisals Ordered At Madrid

### MADRID, April 3—(UP)—Nationalist authorities today ordered all Republican soldiers in the Madrid area to report to concentration camps for classification as to their liability to reprisals for opposing the Nationalists in the civil war.

### It was disclosed that 20,000 former Republican soldiers already had been rounded up, in addition to 1,500 "Red criminals."

### Nationalist authorities planned to divide the Republic soldiers into two groups first, one group, those who had shown no Republican sympathies but were conscripted into the Republican army, were to be released. The others were to be divided into two categories. Those who have Republican sympathies but have committed no "crimes" will be put into labor battalions, it was said, and the remainder, "accused of crimes," will be court martialed.

### Authorities estimated that 150,000 Republican soldiers would surrender in the central (Madrid) zone alone.

### Formal courts martial were expected to start early this week. Agents of the secret police have been busy for days preparing for them.
