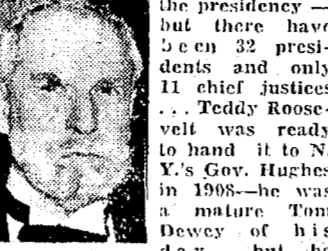

He's had impulses (I'm told) to remove that once reddish beard, but couldn't tamper with a national institution. . . .

Shy behind his beard, he suffered when two wags once accosted him on Fifth ave. when he was Secretary of State, yammering his title. . . . He escaped in a cab. . . . His fan mail is next to FDR's. . . .
