and one dipping operation, the lice and ticks can be eradicated.

The interest for several years in dipping sheep has resulted in a demand for a custom unit. It seems to be the practical solution to the problem of controling these parasites. The dipping outfit to be used on May 22 will be mounted upon a two-wheel trailer. It can be converted for the dipping operation within a few minutes. The total weight of the trailer, gates, tanks and dipping equipment amounts to 1.300 pounds, and the tanks will hold 150 gallons of solution.

Small flocks can be dipped without unhitching from the car. The dipping outfit was manufactured under the guidance of Purdue university.


