

Outstanding Stars Will Be On Good News Show Thursday

Myma Loy, Robert Taylor And Connie Boswell To Augment Regular Cast With Robert Young

Three outstanding stars of screen and radio—Myma Loy, Robert Taylor and songstress Connie Boswell—will be the featured guests of Robert Young on Good News of 1939, Thursday at 8 p. m. over WEA-F. Young will also present regulars Frank Morgan, Fanny Brice, Snooks, Hanley (Daddy) Stafford, Warren Hull and Meredith Willson's orchestra.

Miss Boswell, one of radio's favorite blues singers, will make the first of a series of Good News appearances when she is heard with the orchestra in "And the Angels Sing" and another popular number. This is the second time that Miss Boswell has been signed for a series of engagements on the program.

Meredith Willson will delve into the classics for another Concert Hall selection as well as to present current hit tunes.

Taylor and Miss Loy, who have both performed on previous Good News shows, will appear in their forthcoming scenes from their forthcoming motion picture, "Lucky Night."

Constance Bennett will travel 2,440 miles to help Kate Smith celebrate the ninth anniversary of her debut as a radio artist on WABC, Thursday, at 7 p. m. She will fly from Hollywood to New York after her appearance on Silver Theatre the Sunday preceding to be the singer's guest star.

Celebrating with Kate will be Jack Miller's orchestra, the Ted Straker choir, the "Aldrich Family," Abbott and Costello and Ted Collins, her business partner and program producer since her advent on the airwaves on May 1, 1931.

For her own part in the festivities, which also mark the anniversary of her birth in 1910, Kate will sing the four songs that she presented on her initial broadcast: "I Surrender Dear," "By the River St. Marie," "Dream A Little Dream Of Me" and "Please Don't Talk About Me When I'm Gone." She scheduled the latter just in case her first network appearance turned out to be her last.

A three-year non-cancellable contract, with options thereafter to run indefinitely, was signed by Kate Smith to continue her Thursday evening Variety Hours on WABC.

The contract is believed to be one of the largest and most unusual talent contracts ever signed in the history of radio.

Mischa Levitzki, distinguished American concert pianist, will visit with Bing Crosby and Bob Burns when he drops around to the old Music Hall Thursday to participate in the broadcast from 9 to 11 p. m. Levitzki was educated at public schools in Brooklyn and Manhattan, and made his concert debut at Amherst. A frequent visitor to the Music Hall, the noted pianist-composer has already shown a deft touch in vocal duets and takes with Crosby and Burns. Tall tales by Burns, songs by Crosby, the Music Mails and music by John Scott Trotter's orchestra will round out the program from NBC's Hollywood Radio City.

Elvira Rios, Mexican singer, Bert Lahr, vaudeville comedian, Herbert Marshall, dramatic star, and Cliff Grambsky, Argentinian, will help entertain listeners to Rudy Vallee's Hour Thursday during the WEA-F broadcast from 7 to 8 p. m.

Senorita Rios will sing popular Mexican songs, Marshall is scheduled to star in a dramatic sketch, and Lahr and Argentinian will present comedy specialties.

MUSEUM PARTY OUT OF GUIANA IS COMMENDED

The Swell Avery Expedition into the Brazilian frontier of British Guiana has been called a success by Field Museum after the recovery of more than 60 per cent of its collection of birds, mammals, fish and reptiles.

The expedition had a narrow escape and nearly lost all of its collection of 200 insects and 2,000 vertebrate specimens when the 20-foot boat, Orinoco, capsized while running King William Rapids last Nov. 1.

Emmet E. Blake, assistant curator of birds at the museum and leader of the expedition into the virtually impenetrable jungles, said he and the crew of 15 were "miraculously saved" when they swam to a rock island in mid-river.

They recovered as much of the equipment and collection as was possible and made the rest of the journey to Georgetown, capital of British Guiana, in frail craft.

Blake disembarked at Georgetown Aug. 12. The expedition began collecting bird and animal species Sept. 20. The scientists broke camp in the interior Oct. 19 and began the difficult journey to the coast.

CHINESE ASSERT JAPAN'S LOSSES TOTAL 700,000

CHUNGKING, May 00 — (UP) — The Chungking National Military Council estimates that total Japanese casualties since the war began have mounted to 700,000.

Other estimates: Japanese planes, destroyed or shot down, 649; Japanese pilots killed or captured, 786; Japanese warships sunk or damaged, 580; Japanese tanks and armored cars destroyed or captured, 1,200; Japanese artillery destroyed or captured, 342; Japanese machine guns captured, 4,968; Japanese rifles captured, 72,592.

It was believed by correspondents that the damaged warship figures were greatly exaggerated and probably included small junks and barges which were in the vanguard of the Japanese advance up the Yangtze river. The Japanese navy carefully protects its regular warships.
