Three West Section Clubs Are Strong. This is the second of two articles summarizing prospects of Madison baseball teams in the Home Talent league this season. BY JOE DOMMERSHAUSEN. Their lineups greatly resembling those of 1938, Bowman Dairy, Camp Madison, and the Penn Electric Shop clubs are favored to battle it out for championship honors in the West Madison section of the Pure Home Talent league. These three teams have shown a lot of power in pre-schedule games and should finish, 1-2-3, with the South Side Men's club, Gardner Baking co., and Ed Phillips & Sons being battling for the places in the second division. City teams in the league lift the lid on their schedules Sunday afternoon with six games, three in each section. The games in the West Madison division will be featured by Bowman Dairy's invasion of Camp Madison. Gardner Baking co. and Penn Electric Shop meet at Franklin field, and the South Side Men's club and Ed Phillips & Sons meet at Intramural field. Heavyweights Add Two Hurlers. Originally two doubleheaders had been scheduled in the two city sections for Sunday, but the league was granted permission Wednesday to use intramural diamonds and the second games of the twin-bills slated for Burr-Jones and Franklin fields were transferred. The Gogger's Jewelers and Oscar Mayer Packers meet in the other contest at Intramural field. Bowman Dairy, which copped the championship of the Madison section last year with Camp Madison and the Penn Electric tying for second, will present practically the same club as last season but with the addition of two hurlers, Dave Aida and Ham Watson, and Vern Bacon, an infielder. However, Bud Wehrle, the league hitting champion last year, is missing from the lineup which Doug Evans and Bill Murphy will pilot. "Bud" Siltson's Camp Madison club will definitely be one of the teams in the first division if its showing in pre-schedule games are any criterion. The CCC nine has three fine hurlers with Gerald "Gib" Kennedy, a Madison youth, heading the tab. The club has one of the niftiest infield
