Death Plot Hint Tightens Benes' Guard

CHICAGO-(U.P)- Deputy police Commissioner John M. Prendergast revealed Saturday that he has ordered extraordinary precautions to prevent an attack ipon Eduard Benes, former president of Czechoslovakia, as result of a warning cabled from Paris.

Prendergast ordered cruising squads to exercise unusual vigilnce around Benes' hotel. In addition two Bohemian-speaking plain clothesmen previously assigned to guard Benes were adised of the warning.

The cablegram was addressed to Clifton M. Utely, head of the Chicago Foreign Relations council, by Johnathan Griffin, whom Utley described as a "freelance writer" in Paris. The message:

"Please see Benes has all police protection. Possible assassination planned. Czechs here fear Benes neglects precautions. Not all Czechs safe."

Prendergast interpreted the last sentence as indcating that the possible threat to Benes came from disgruntled fellow-countrymen. At the same time E. B. Hitch-

cock, personal aide to Benes, admitted hearing "several rumors" of plots against Benes and professed to be "not much concern ed."


