## Boaz Village to Vote June 24 on Incorporation

RICHLAND CENTER—Application for the incorporation of the village of Boaz was granted here Friday, subject to a referendum election, by Circuit Judge S. E. Smalley.

The proposed village of Boaz has a population of 230 and an area of one-half square mile. The incorporation will be voted Saturday, June 24.

Threats of opposition to the incorporation evaporated in Friday's hearing. Only one farmer arose to object.

The move to incorporate was started after the spring election. Proponents of the new village claimed that Boaz was paying too high a tax for what services it received from the town of Dayton. A street lighting system is one of the alleged objects for incorporating.

O. A. Oliver, store manager; Ernest Koch, garage operator; and Frank Harris, saw-mill operator, were appointed commissioners in charge of the referendum election. Frank Fogo, Richland Center attorney, is counsel for the incorporators.
