## Benchley And Orchestra To Present Another Travelogue; Johnny Green Will Join In Singing

A newspaper columnist and a noted music authority will put on their "thinking caps" for the benefit of those stalwarts, John Kieran and Franklin P. Adams, who on the board of experts meets during the Information Please program Tuesday, from 7:30 to 8:00 p. m., over WJZ. The guest experts are H. I. Phillips, conductor of the syndicated column, "The Sun Dial," and Deems Taylor, music critic, commentator and composer. Taylor will be making his second appearance on the program. Clifton Fadiman, as usual, will be on hand with his unpredictable questions designed to "stump the experts."

## Stronger Hand By George VI Likely, And Canadians Evidence Anew Their Unity With Homeland

ABOARD THE ROYAL PILOT TRAIN IN ONTARIO, En Route, June 6 — (UP) — The visit of George Sixth and Queen Elizabeth to Canada succeeded in its objectives far beyond the fondest hopes of the king, the British and Canadian governments and their advisers.

A source in daily contact with the King told me that the King himself is constantly astonished and delighted by the outburst of loyalty to the millions and the enthusiasm for the royal couple.

The principal objectives of the 16,654 mile journey, the longest and most arduous ever undertaken by a reigning monarch, have all been attained and surpassed.

First firm reintegration of Canada with the British commonwealth of nations.

Second, the commencement of a phase of a more "dynamic" conception of the role of the constitutional monarchy in empire and domestic affairs.

Third, enormous augmentation of the personal prestige and popularity of the king and queen throughout the empire.

Fourth, a remarkable increase in the personal self confidence of the king.

**JENKINS FIRST CANDIDATE TO FILE PETITIONS**

Municipal Judge M. B. Jenkins is the first Lima candidate to file for office in the approaching August primaries.

Names of candidates seeking other offices in Lima, including mayor, will be carried on a non-party ballot.

Up to noon Tuesday there had been no filings from Bluffton on either the Democratic or Republican ticket. Neither has there been any filing on the Republican ticket from Delphos. Seven Democrats have filed for various offices to be filled at Delphos.

# SPENDING HIT BY VANDENBERG

## Michigan Senator Urges Youth To Save U. S. From All Extremes

SYRACUSE, June 6 — (INS) — Sen. Arthur H. Vandenberg, of Michigan, who recently made himself available for the Republican presidential nomination, yesterday called on the youth of the nation to save the country for "the American system of government," from "Communism on the left" and "Fascism on the right."

"Speaking to the graduating class of Syracuse university, he indicted the administration as one which has confused and bewildered the country."

"Your own country," Vandenberg said, "our own country—unhappily is no stranger to vicissitudes. We have nobly and bravely braved old deals and new deals and square deals — and occasionally a gigantic paradox."

"For example, we spend to save; we hunt more prosperity by going deeper into debt; we try to stretch an annual income of 60 billions into an annual income of 80 billions by squandering the difference; we dig gold, pay for it, and they bury it back in the ground again out at Fort Knox."

"We call 12,000,000 unemployed in 1932 a depression, and we call 12,000,000 unemployed in 1939 a recovery and announce that 'we planned it that way'; we lecture foreigners about democracy and set by virtual government by executive decree ourselves; we kill little pigs while children cry for food; we have purges and appointments in such a haphazard and confusing succession that the man on a flying trapeze seems strategic in comparison."
