British-born stars of stage, screen, and radio who are now filling engagements in the United States will unite today in a radio salute for King George VI and Queen Elizabeth. Gertrude Lawrence, celebrated actress, conceived the idea for the 60-minute show and will appear in the New York portion. The program will be aired at 1 p. m. through station WMAQ.

Miss Lawrence will be mistress of ceremonies for the first section and, with Herbert Marshall, will anchor a scene from "Private Lives." Sir Adrian Boult will conduct the NBC Symphony orchestra; Ray Noble's orchestra will offer dance tunes; the Norstrom and Dennis King will sing, and Judith Anderson and Laurence Olivier will do a Shakespearean excerpt.

Other features, coming from Hollywood, will be: Ronald Colman and Madeleine Carroll in a bit from "The Prisoner of Zenda"; Anna Neagle in a soliloquy from "Queen Victoria"; Leslie Howard, Vivien Leigh, and Edna Best in a scene from "Berkeley Square"; David Niven, Basil Rathbone, Errol Flynn, and Brian Aherne in a satire on "The Women"; Cecilia Loftus in impersonations; Sir Cedric Hardwicke, C. Aubrey Smith, and Nigel Bruce singing "Three Little Fishies"; Freddie Bartholomew in an informal talk; Sir Frederick Lonsdale leading a toast to their majesties.
