UNCLE RAY'S CORNER • By Uncle Ray. THREE KINDS OF CAVES. Most caves are made by water, but some are produced by explosions of volcanoes. In Iceland, caves have been formed in large numbers after the eruption of volcanoes. This is a usual way they have been made: A volcano sent out a stream of lava, and it flowed down a slope until it was halted by something, such as a hollow on the slope. When the lava stream stopped, the outside cooled quickly and hardened into rock. The inside stayed hot, very hot. Before long, the hot inside burst and broke a hole in one side. This hole became the entrance to a cave. Caves of this kind exist in the Canary islands and the Azores, as well as in Iceland. Some of them are more than 100 feet wide. Long cave-like tunnels have been formed by flowing lava. Other caves have been built by waves dashing against cliffs. Slowly but surely the water wears away the rock, and sometimes the ledges above tumble down. For many years, however, the cliff is likely to have one or more caves in it. Wave-made caves have been cut in some parts of the shore of Lake Superior, and they have become famous for their number and large size. The greatest caves were made by water running under the ground. In many places, rivers or small streams flow through channels which they have cut into rock. They are supplied with water from rain or melting snow. The water seeps down into the ground, and passes into cracks in the rock layers. When the water flows over beds of limestone, it will in time gouge into the rock and make a large hollow. Thousands of years are needed for a good-sized cave to be made in this way. Among the famous limestone caves on this continent are the Carlsbad caverns of New Mexico and Mammoth cave in Kentucky. In Mammoth cave are miles and miles of rooms and passages. One room is 250 feet wide and 400 feet long. In some places the ceiling is over 200 feet high. The Carlsbad caverns contain perhaps the largest room in the world. It is large enough to hold several ocean liners. In fact, the "Queen Mary," "The Queen Elizabeth" and the "Normandie" might be placed end to end inside it. The greatest height of the ceiling in this room is about 300 feet. Tomorrow: Caves of Europe.
