

# Unusual Hobbies Scheduled For Discussion Wednesday

Bats, bulls, harmonicas and wedding customs among Dave Elman's Topics On Regular Broadcast

Bats, bulls, harmonicas and wedding customs are included in a diversified list of hobbies that will be discussed by guests on Dave Elman's Hobby Lobby, Wednesday at 7:30 p. m. over WJZ.

The bat fancier is Milton Campbell, a service station operator of San Antonio, Texas, who has a whole aviary full of the winged rodents. Campbell has been a bat cultivator for 25 years, and not once, he says, have they gotten into his hair.

Bull-man is James Bannon of Fulton, N. Y. He specializes in making toys and gadgets to exercise bulls—a practical hobby because of the strength and unpredictable temper of the average bull. Thru his hobby Bannon has devised ways to use up the bull's excess energy, making things safer for farmer and picnicker alike.

Ramon Nagle, of Dorchester, Mass., will illustrate how he won twenty-seven harmonica prizes in the last year, while Miss Claudia DeLy, of New York City, will tell the origin of present-day wedding customs which we take as a matter of course.

"What's My Name," which will replace the Allen show for the summer, is a new type of quiz program in which contestants from the studio audience identify well-known personalities by means of biographical clues. If the questions were, for example, "I was born in Boston, worked in the Boston public library, and married a girl named after a city in Oregon," the answer would be "Fred Allen."

Another venture of Tommy Dorsey's into the song-writing field will be one of the features of his show Wednesday over WEAF. The song is "This Is No Dream," and Tommy wrote it in collaboration with Benny Davis, who wrote the lyrics to "Margie," and Ted Shapiro, composer of the old favorite "If I Had You." 
