Phil Still Ambitious, Wiley Says

WASHINGTON — Sen. Wiley, who defeated Democratic Sen. F. Ryan Duffy, thus paving the way for Duffy to get the lifetime job, at \$10,000 a year, of federal judge for the eastern district of Wisconsin, commented on Wisconsin politics:

"I doubt whether Phil (former Gov. La Follette), is ready at this time to relinquish his ambition to head a third party. Some have long thought, however, that Bob (Sen. La Follette) is not only sympathetic with the New Deal, but willing to join the Democrats. In the latter course is followed, in 1940, you may expect to see a very interesting contest in Wisconsin."

Secretary of Agriculture Wallace, denying firmly he has any intention of resigning in response to the demand of the Wisconsin Republican assemblymen, and asked to comment on recent Wisconsin developments, said: "I think the Wisconsin developments are fruitful to the welfare of this country. I met interesting people there."
