

Defense Of Hot Dog Marks Rudy Vallee Radio Program

Grover Whalen Guest Star On Thursday Night; Kate Smith To Appear In Airwaves Sketch

Allegations that a hot dog, with mustard, costs a dollar-and-a-half on the grounds of the New York World's Fair will be termed as base calumny by Grover Whalen, the Fair's president, when he speaks over WEAF Thursday, as guest on Rudy Vallee's program.

It all started last Thursday when Doc Rockwell, appearing as Rudy's guest, jokingly said that he had paid one dollar for a hot dog at the fair and, since he was on a vacation and price meant nothing, an additional 50 cents for mustard.

When the furor had died down on Flushing Meadows, Vallee invited Grover Whalen to appear personally to answer the charges made by the screwball comedian. Whalen accepted immediately and will contend that the hot-dog of tomorrow is reasonably priced.

While the fate of the hot-dog, which recently, won international distinction, what with it serving as the main course for kings and queens, hangs in the balance, Vallee will present stars of the stage and screen as guest artists during the program over WEAF from 7:00 to 8:00 p. m.

Among those scheduled to be heard are May Robson, actress for 55 years; Carmen Miranda, sensational Latin-American singing and dancing star of the Broadway success, "The Streets of Paris," making her first radio appearance in the United States; and Lou Holtz, dialect comedian, making his fifth successive guest appearance. Miss Robson will be heard in a one-act play.

Kate Smith will double as a dramatic actress when she takes time out from songs to star in the dramatic sketch on the farewell broadcast of her current series of "Kate Smith Hours" over WABC Thursday, at 7:00 p. m.

Presented for the last time this season will be the Ted Straker, Chair and Abbott and Costello, From Kate's program, the "Aldrich Family" starring Ezra Stone, and Jack Miller's orchestra will move into Jack Benny's spot on WEAF Sunday, July 2.

A biographical note is detectable in the original dramatic sketch in which Kate will get top billing supported by Ted Collins, who is also making his first start as a player of serious drama. Kate is cast as an unknown girl with a beautiful voice who is discovered by Ted Collins, taking the role of a business man with an ear for musical talent.

Despite her debut as an actress on her own program, Kate's musical repertoire for the evening is even richer than usual. She will be heard in a selection of old and new songs including "Wishing," "Don't Worry 'Bout Me," "In the Middle of a Dream," "When Your Lover Has Gone," "If I Didn't Care" and "God Bless America."

Edward Arnold and Allen Jenkins, both stellar film actors, and Irene Jessner, NBC artist and a star of the Metropolitan Opera Co., will share the Music Hall

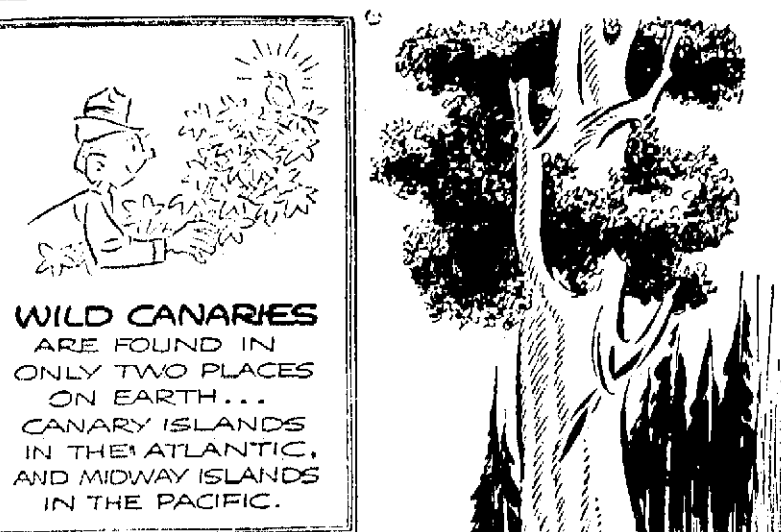

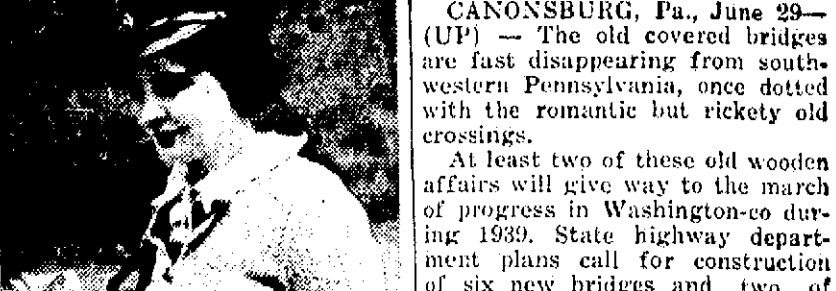
