Miss Francis and Uttal will invite members of the studio audience to identify well-known persons by means of various clues. Music for the program will be under the direction of Peter Van Steeden.

Latest addition to cast of the Edith Meiser script story, "The Life and Love of Dr. Susan," is Robert Regent in the role of Peter Bradford.

Among the hosts of Hollywood luminaries who have appeared on the Star theatre are Max Reinhardt, Adolphe Menjou, John Bar-

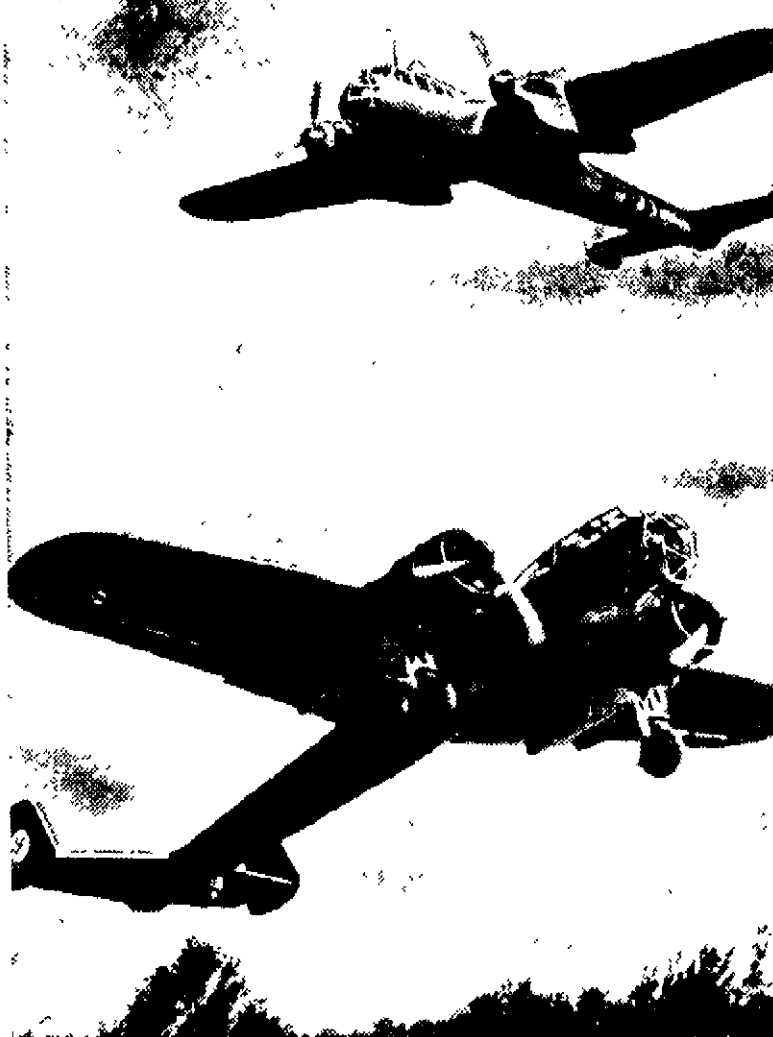

ATKINSON SAYS FERGUSON LIES OVER EXPENSES

COLUMBUS, O., July 12—(AP)—State Auditor Joseph T. Ferguson, who accused H. C. Atkinson of including two quarts of liquor, soda and a hotel bill for Mrs. Atkinson on an expense account, was described today by the bureau of unemployment compensation administrator as "a plain, ordinary, everyday liar."

Atkinson, insisting that he paid those items personally, said that he charged the state only for legitimate expenses on a trip to Dayton. His statement was made after Ferguson announced he was returning the expense account unapproved.

Ferguson said that he learned thru a check of records at a Dayton hotel that the whisky and soda was listed on the bill as restaurant expense and that Mrs. Atkinson's room rent had been added.

The liquor, Ferguson said, cost \$4.50 a quart. Atkinson said he charged the state "only proper expenses."

"I entertained some people in my room and the cost of this, and the extra cost for Mrs. Atkinson, I paid personally," he asserted.

"Joe Ferguson is a plain out-and-out liar if he says I attempted to evade payments of any bills incurred by me."

Atkinson, who receives a salary of \$7,500 yearly, said he would check the bill today with members of his staff.

Francis W. Durbin of Lima, Democratic chairman of Allen-co, said today he had written Gov. John W. Bricker demanding the resignation of Atkinson "in the interest of good government."

DEFENDANT IN MAIL FRAUD SUIT DIES IN NORWALK

CLEVELAND, July 12—(AP)—Bruce B. Brady, 42, who was to have gone on trial Oct. 3 in federal court on charges of using the mails to defraud, violating the securities and exchange act of 1933 and conspiracy, died last night in a Norwalk hospital.

Death was due to blood poisoning, caused from a tennis blister on his foot.

Brady and six associates in the Hixcox Finance Corp. were indicted in March, 1938. The other defendants are Sidney L. Stein, treasurer of the company; Stanley B. Gilson, secretary; Ben Phillips, office manager; Ernest P. Curtz, president; Robert L. Gray, office manager of the company's branch in Ironton, O., and Albert J. Potts, office manager of the Toledo branch.

U. S. Attorney Emerich B. Freed said the six would go on trial as scheduled in October.
