City officials were pleased today with the report that Madison's obligations and bonds had won the highest New York "blue chip" endorsement in an official investment schedule, as many other municipalities failed to qualify. New York makes a rigid scrutiny of all municipal obligations sold in the state. Mayor Law explained the city still has a \$1,038,000 debt margin, and will reduce its bonded debt by \$100,000 this year. The city now has about \$5,335,000 outstanding debts, with no short term obligations. That figure includes the \$1,019,250 for construction work this year.
