Recalling those school days, Donat declares: "I found that it was a great aid to training my memory to note the names of all the shops, garages and restaurants which the trolley passed.

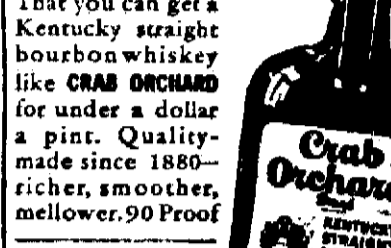
