DREDGE WILL BE USED IN RESCUE OF ARMY PLANE

(Special To The Lima News) ST. MARYS, July 26—Salvage operations were scheduled to start today in the removal of the Army OA-9 amphibian airplane, which crashed Monday in landing in Lake St. Marys.

John Sunderland, lake superintendent, was authorized by W. H. Wheelock, director of inland lakes and parks, to fire the dredge and to have it in readiness to remove the huge 850,000 plane. As soon as the steam has accumulated the dredge will be taken out to the crash scene and the boom hooked onto the four ton amphibian. The plane will be lifted out of the water and carried over to Gordon State Park where it will be loaded on trucks to be returned to Wright Field, Dayton.

The nose was broken off the plane Monday after it cracked up in landing on the lake. Apparently the nose broke off after it had buried itself in the mud, the weight of the plane carrying it on over.

The two pilots, Lieut. M. D. Birnside and Captain R. L. Boatner, both of Wright field, Dayton, escaped from the enclosed cockpits after strenuous effort. They first had to remove their safety belts and parachute packs, then crawl thru the window of the submerged cockpits and up to the surface where they were picked up by John Sunderland, lake superintendent, in the state patrol boat.
