The screen play by Harry Tugend, based on a story by George Bradshaw, has been skillfully directed, so that the most is made of an appealing and realistic tale.

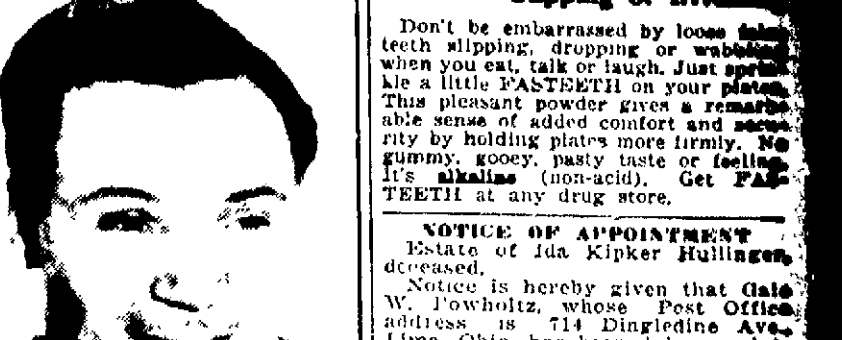
Officers Elected by Dairy Herd Association
