

Thrilling Adventures Will Be Related Monday Evening

Sunken Treasure Search, Experiences In Sino-Japanese War To Highlight Broadcast At 7 P. M.

Breathtaking experiences revolving around the search for sunken treasure and the Sino-Japanese war will be held by Captain John D. Craig, author of "Danger is My Business" and Arthur L. Burton, an American business man who has just returned from the Orient, when they are initiated into The Order of Adventurers on Monday.

Captain Craig is now engaged in salvaging the Merida, an American liner which sailed from Mexico in 1911 with wealthy refugees fleeing from the Madeira revolution.

Burton's adventure occurred while he was in charge of an American-owned manufacturing plant in China. The advancing Japanese army was on the verge of destroying the buildings and machinery when Burton's coolness and quick thinking not only prevented a massacre but saved the plant for his employers.

The third story on the program will be told by a member of the executive board, which consists of Lowell Thomas, Admiral Richard E. Byrd, Colonel Theodore Roosevelt, Roy Chapman Andrews and Commander Felix Reisenberg.

Also to be featured with Lew Lehr, he of the monkey opinion, will be Colonel Lemuel Q. Stoopnagle; the concert orchestra, conducted by Nathaniel Shilkret; the "rhyming the Rovers" Sisters, an LeRoy Miller, who will introduce a popular dance band.

Lehr has vigorously denied reports that he is descendant of a tribe of wacky goatherds who romped the Arabian steppes for years and is half-brother of Frankenstein and Madame Recamier.

"Monkeys might be de evazietese people, but the more I observe dese alleged nature's bubblemen—phooey, I dink peoples is still evazier," Lehr made the statement after Colonel Stoopnagle expounded an idea for a stove nailed to the ceiling for baking upside down cakes.

When Keighley came out of the stage, the men fell into line for inspection. The director passed thru the lines and picked a man here, another there. When it was all over, the 200 men selected marched happily away to be fitted with convict garb and be herded into prison. The others marched dejectedly to freedom.
