## Lost Play Series To Revive First Belasco Hit Thursday

Maude Adams Made Debut In "La Belle Russe"; Jose Iturbi Is Bob Burns' Guest In Music Hall

"La Belle Russe," David Belasco's first smash hit and the drama in which Maude Adams made her stage debut, will be presented over WEAF Thursday from 8 to 9 p. m. as the sixth production in the series of America's Lost Plays.

"La Belle Russe" is the only example extant of Belasco's early work in California. It was produced at San Francisco in 1881 with Miss Adams in the role of Little Beatrice and created an immediate sensation. Soon other companies were doing tremendous business in London and New

Belasco, however, had made the mistake of selling all his rights to the play for the sum of \$1,500 with the result that his name was ignored by the producers. It was not until he




