## 'Down Under' Officials to Salute Fair in Air's Highlight Tonight



Australia's salute to the New York World's fair, featuring a talk by Prime Minister Robert Gordon Menzies and a dramatization of Australia's historical development with radio pickups from the country's factories, forests, and fields, will be heard in a half-hour broadcast flashed from "way down under" at 8 o'clock tonight through NBC-WGN.
