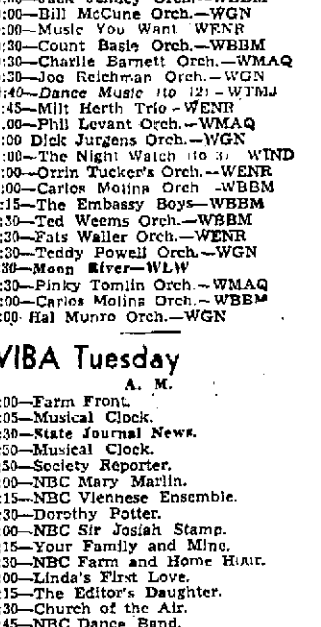

Daughter can show you how she mixes a cake . . . your young son can demonstrate how he fixes a bicycle tire or makes his dog "play dead" . . . friend wife can display the operation of her sewing-machine . . . or if she's taking the pictures, you can perform with the lawn mower before the camera.

"Story" pictures of such common, everyday activities make fine contest entries—aside from their value in your collection. When you start on a good idea, shoot a whole series of pictures—pick out the best for the contest—then print prints of all of them in your album. You don't really have to go beyond your own home for snapshots of prize-winning calibre.

Another opportunity awaits the amateur photographer to win fame and fortune via a snapshot. Enter the fourth Wisconsin State Journal Amateur Snapshot Contest. Eight winners will be awarded \$12 by this paper and an additional chance will be provided to compete in the \$10,000 Newspaper National Awards. Deadline for the fourth contest is Aug. 18.

ONE—The contest is strictly for amateurs. Anyone is eligible except employees of the Wisconsin State Journal and their families, and individuals or members of families connected in the manufacture, advertising, commercial or professional use of photographic goods.

TWO—Entrants may submit as many pictures as desired at any time during the period of the contest. (See paragraph 6.)

THREE—Pictures must have been made after May 13, 1939.

FOUR—Your snapshots may be made on any type of film, but must not be made on glass plate negatives. Any make of camera, film, chemicals, or paper may be used. Developing and printing may be done by a photo finisher or the entrant. No print or enlargement more than 10 inches in the longest dimension will be accepted.

IMPORTANT: If you snap a picture which you expect to enter in the contest and to which a person or persons appear, be sure you get their names and addresses. This is necessary because before your picture can become eligible for entry in the contest, you must advise the person or persons to the use of the picture for advertising purposes must be obtained.
