Pigeons Must Go, Says Manager of Auditorium

MILWAUKEE—(U.P.)—Manager Joseph C. Grieb of the Milwaukee auditorium held today that the constitutional guarantee of freedom of assembly does not apply to pigeons. Consequently, hundreds of the birds faced the imminent danger of expulsion from their favorite loafing refuge under the eaves of the auditorium annex. It was explained that their presence there was contrary to the public interest since it required expenditure of taxpayers' money for occasional cleaning of a handsome red brick facade underneath their perch.

Grieb and auditorium board members, who have had to solve many a ticklish problem in connection with use of the building by Communists and German-American bundamen, explained the simple device by which they hope to drive out the pigeons. A wide strip of brass with several rows of triangular tongues will be installed on the birds' "promenade."
