Unknown Czech Wrote Beer Barrel Polka

strong.

It took an insignificant tune from a country that no longer exists to outshine all current American songs and skyrocket to first place among the nation's popular hits. It's "The Beer Barrel Polka" that is still the No. 1 tune on over 300,000 automatic record machines throughout the country and it was written by a Czechoslovakian, Jaromir Vejvoda.

Back in central Europe where polkas are the custom rather than a novelty, some four or five years ago, Vejvoda peddled his song for months with little or no success-a discouragement with which so many of our American songwriters are familiar. He finally approached a recording company whose records, are almost entirely foreign export material. Vejvoda sold his tune, a small brass band called Wild Glahe's Musette orchestra recorded it and a limited number of the

records were distributed in this country. Several owners of the automatic "drop-a-nickel" phonographs placed the records in the coin machines around foreign settlements. Most of them were sent to the industrial cago, Detroit, and Milwaukee. Before you could say "Beer Barrel Polks." Will Glahe's record was being played on tens-of-thousands of coin machines, the music was hum-

med on the streets, in homes, and at parties. Then, Lew Brown famous American librettist, rolled out lyrics for it; Vladimir Timm suggested the title, "Beer Barrel Polka" and on March 29 Eddie DeLange and his band recorded the revamped tune in good old American swingtime. Immediately, other bands added the tune to their repertoire and by public demand, it climbed to the top bracket of the hit parade.

The polka, of course, isn't new to our music lovers. It's a Bohemian dance of Polish origin, in two-four measure with the second beat accented. Big name maestri have found it an excellent type of music old-classical and swing lovers

Adding beer barrel lyrics to a polka rhythm struck a chord of popularity with dancers from the jitterbug bug variety to the most conservative of ballroom waltzers, and with "The Beer Barrel Polka" winning all current musical laurels, it looks as though Bohemian dance music is here

In fact two companies released records of "The W. P. A. Polka", "Jelly Roll Polka,"
