International Red Cross on Air Tuesday

WASHINGTON —A world-wide broadcast, originating from New York, Washington and Geneva, Switzerland, Tuesday afternoon will carry the voices of two international Red Cross leaders to 40,-000,000 organization members throughout the world who today are celebrating the anniversary of the Red Cross by paying tribute

to Herni Dunant, its founder. Norman H. Davis, chairman of the American Red Cross and of the League of Red Cross Societies, will speak from New York, while the voice of Judge Max Huber, presi-dent of International Red Cross Committee, will be picked up by short wave from Geneva. The pro-gram will be aired by station WLS

In observing the three quarters century mark of the Red Cross, the program will be built around the signing of the Treaty of Geneva, which, on August 22, 1864, created th Red Cross. The treaty conference was called by Dunant who, live years previously, had seen 40,000 men slain in the battle of Solfering. Moved by the suffering of the unattended dying, Dunant, a Swiss idealist, aided by friends summoned nine European powers to Geneva to draft an agreement for the neutralization of war wounded and the relief forces
