

Bluffton Council Puts Sewage Disposal Plant Up To

(Special To The Limn News) BLUFFTON, Aug. 28 -Whether Bluffton will issue bonds for its share of the cost of WPA sewage disposal project will be submitted to voters of the was decided by the Bluffton council recently.

The engineering firm of Chamme, Finkbeiner and Associates of Toledo is making estimates of the cost of an intercepting sewer system and also for a complete system covering the entire town. This action is necessary to place the bond issue on the ticket this fall.

Regardless of the system adopted by the town, a disposal plant will be built. An interceptmg sewage system would adequately take care of the Page Dairy waste, according to the engineers. It was also pointed out that this system would be from 72 to 95 per cent efficient, and that in addition to disposing of sewerage improved conditions would materially reduce the prevalence of mosquitoes. Official action will be taken by

the village council as soon as the estimates are prepared. Application to place the issue on the ballot at the November election must be made with the county election hoard by Sept. 8. The town of Bluffton has a

\$2,266,675 property valuation and outstanding bonds of \$32,450, and can issue up to \$80.833 in bonds \$75.000. Twenty-year bonds : at tax levy of 21/2 mills. A 65 per cent vote would be re-
