Pope Pius XII will appeal to the world for peace Wednesday for the second time in two weeks. The pontiff's address will be aired by stations WIBA, WMAQ, WCFB, and WBBM at 5 a. m. He will speak before 20,000 workers in Rome.

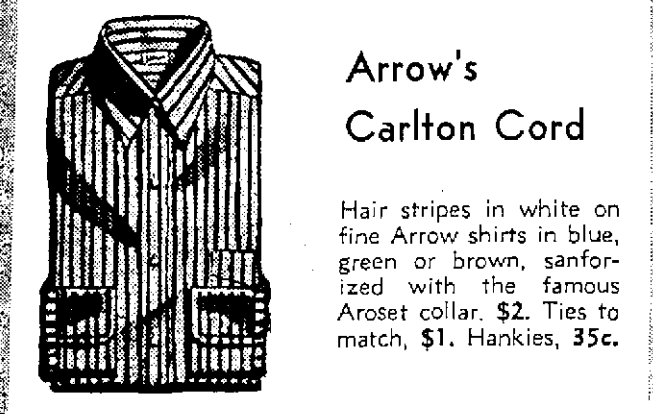
