Halfbacks Jimmy Richardson and Edward O'Brien proved good marksmen with their forward passes, prompting Driscoll to tighten up the aerial defense.

### ILLINOIS

#### CHAMPAIGN, Ill.

Gerald Elders, sophomore quarterback back, was shifted to guard; Bob Ingle, reserve letter man, was changed from guard to tackle, and Landis Hurley, reserve guard, was at tackle Wednesday during Illinois practice. Ingle worked out with the first team line with Kirschke, another reserve letter man, getting his first chance at the other tackle. Don Elting was in the regular back field after making consistent gains during the first scrimmage Tuesday.

### CHICAGO
