## Legal Aid Body Reports Heavy August Load

Averaging one new case a day, the Madison Legal Aid bureau had an unusually heavy case load in August, according to the agency's monthly service report just submitted to the Community Union.

Fifty-six clients were added by the bureau which offers free legal service to those unable to hire an attorney. Thirty cases were new during the month and others were carried over from July. Over half of the new clients were referred by public officers, including the district attorney, industrial commission, and city attorney. Others were sent in by private lawyers and social agencies. All but three cases were settled out of court.

The Legal Aid bureau is sponsored by the Dane County Bar assn. and the University of Wisconsin law school and is financed by the Community Union. Robert MacIver and Charles Prieve have been staff members this summer.

**Mayors Hear Law-Making Discussion**  
WAUSAU—Law-making powers of city schools and village boards as derived from state statutes were summarized in a talk by R. J. Cunningham, legal counsel of the League of Wisconsin Municipalities, this morning before the 41st annual convention of the league here.

Cunningham pointed out that ordinances are unlawful which are discriminatory, interfere with interstate commerce, take property for public use without just compensation, impair contract obligations, use taxing powers for other than public purposes, and involve unlawful delegations of power.
