

# ENGINE OWNER PAYS FINE FOR ROAD DAMAGE

KENTON, Sept. 16-Gus Koch of Wapakoneta reported to Hardin-co officials in a harassed state of mind yesterday that he didn't mind misplacing minor articles such as his glasses or pen and pencil but when it came to losing a four-wheeled 25 horsepower steam engine, he felt that some kind of aid was needed in the search.


Koch appeared in Sheriff Lloyd Norman's office to report the "theft" of the steam engine from its parking place at the edge of State Route 67 at Anstine hill near Roundhead. The owner told officials he was pulling a wagon behind the engine on route to another wood cutting job in the Roundhead vicinity the previous night. A member of the state highway patrol sighted the "caravan' and ordered Koch to leave the engine. at the side of the road for the evening because wheel lugs were cutting into the hot road surface. Koch obliged but when he returned to the spot in the morning he found only the wagon, sans steam engine. As he completed his report to local officials, the "culprit," a member of the state highway patrol, appeared and reported the engine's new resting place as the highway garage in Wapakoneta where it was hauled during the night in a truck to prevent road damage


