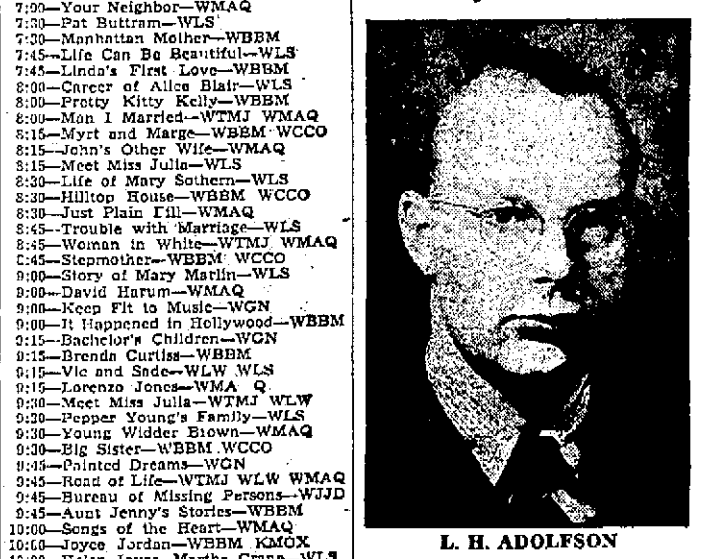

U. W. Extension Plans Course on History in Making



The world crisis precipitated by the European war and its probable implications for the United States will receive major emphasis in the adult class in "History in the Making" which the University of Wisconsin extension division is organizing for people of the Madison area.

The topics, designed to give a survey of underlying factors leading to the outbreak in Europe and to the philosophies governing the course followed, respectively, by Hitler, Stalin, Mussolini, and the Japanese diplomats.
