Famed Blondin Cooked Omelet on Tightrope

The past summer I watched a tightrope walker at a large cir-Standing perhaps 10 feet above the ground, he turned a flip. While he was turning in mid-air he passed a hoop over his body —then landed safely on the tight

That seemed to me the most remarkable act of a tightrope expert I had ever seep. I was not, however, among the thousands of persons who watched Charles Blondin make tightrope trips across the Nia-gara river in 1859 and 1860. The first such journey, as reported in the New York Times of July 1, 1859, was performed in front of "a crowd of from 5,000 to 10,000." The time of walking from the American to the Canadian shore was 17 minutes. Blondin later crossed in faster time.

Retired in England

In later life, Blondin went to England and retired from his work. For years he lived in Manchester. Then came a new call to appear before the public. He accepted it, though he had reached the age of 68.

After that, he carried his son across on his back, and traversed the rope on a bicycle."

Blondin lived to the age of 73, His last appearance before the public took place in Beifast, Ireland, only a year before he died. He said one day, 'I am willing to walk across Niagara, but I would never take a chance on stepping off
